LOCAL BUSINESS- SCHOOL ENGAGEMENT



PPIE continues to work with business partners to engage our students, reaching over 800 students this year! In its 4th year, we co-hosted our annual Mock Interview program with the Foothill High School DECA program. Local business volunteers from various companies donated their time to conduct mock interviews. This real-world experience provided many students with their first-ever opportunity to prep and take part in a professional interview. We also expanded our Business-School Engagement program, matching professionals as class speakers and club mentors, such as Dr. Suszy Bernat speaking to students in several Principles of Biomedical Science classes, and Omron Robotics, which mentors our middle and high school robotics clubs. Special thanks to City of Pleasanton, Clorox, and Omron for helping to fund this program!

WELLNESS SUPPORT

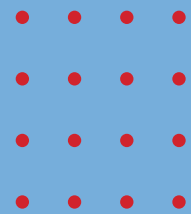

INTERVENTION SPECIALISTS

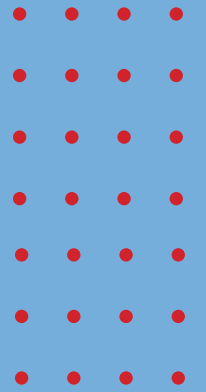

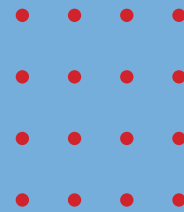
TECHNOLOGY SPECIALISTS

Increased Support to PUSD

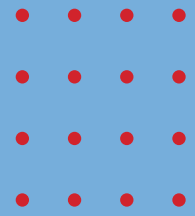


PPIE raises money in 4 key ways: business sponsors, events, major donors, and family giving. Family giving is approximately 75% of our total funding.
